HIGHLIGHTED EVENTS:

Sheriff's Safer Schools Initiative

Delhi Township Deputies conducted 127 visits to various Holt Public School buildings in the month of March. In coordination with the Delhi Fire Department, ICSSO staff members have begun security assessments at each of the Holt School buildings which should be concluded in the month of May, and will continue on an annual basis.

Highlighted Calls for Service

3/06/18. We assisted Child Protective Services with the removal of a 2 year old male and a 14 year old female at a Delhi residence. The residents were not cooperative. The father was found in a back bedroom with the 2 year old child refusing to come to the door. Deputies were able to talk him out of the bedroom without incident and the child was safely turned over to CPS staff.

3/07/18. Night shift Deputies responded to a PPO violation stating a male subject was stalking the caller and looking into his vehicle. The suspect fled on foot and subsequently assaulted Deputies during the arrest. The suspect was taken into custody and has been referred for mental health treatment.

3/09/18. Deputies and Detectives investigated a DOA above a Delhi business. No foul play is suspected in the death.

3/10/18. Sgt. Daenzer stopped a vehicle that was slow to stop upon initial contact. The driver was subsequently arrested on a felony parole violation warrant. K9 search located methamphetamine, cocaine and marijuana in the vehicle. The suspect had thrown a handgun out of the car prior to stopping, which was located a short distance from the vehicle.

3/16/18. Deputy Lo responded to a suicidal subject who was holding a knife to their chest, and had stabbed themselves during prior incidents. The subject responded to requests to cooperate and was safely taken into protective custody for mental health treatment.

3/17/18. Deputies responded to the Happy's Inn Motel for an assault. Suspects fled the scene on foot, but were located a short distance away and arrested on unrelated warrants.

3/19/18. Deputies responded to a suicidal subject at the Stonegate Mobile Home Community. A female residence told her loved ones that she had taken a large amount of medications, she told them goodbye and walked away into the woods. A search was conducted with the assistance of a helicopter from the Michigan National Guard. The woman was located and safely taken into protective custody for medical and psychological treatment.

3/22/18. Deputy Vanells responded to a bicycle theft where two bicycles had been stolen by juvenile suspects in the area. The bikes and suspects were located a short time later and the bikes were returned to the owner.

3/23/18. Deputies responded to a large fight in progress at the Aspen Lakes complex. The group had fled prior to police arrival, and the witnesses were uncooperative.

3/31/18. Deputy Khan located a vehicle which had been dispatched as an attempt to locate a reckless driver. He stopped the vehicle and subsequently arrested the driver for 3rd offense, operating while intoxicated.

3/31/18. Dep. Belanger responded to a domestic assault and subsequently arrested one of the involved parties for strangulation.

STATISTICS:

During the month of March, Deputies responded to 220 calls for service, made 363 traffic stops and wrote 137 citations. They investigated 31 traffic crashes. They also made 45 arrests, 37 of which were self-initiated, proactive arrests. Deputies dedicated 255 hours to community policing and participated in 51 hours of training.

In support of the Sheriff's Safer Schools Initiative, Delhi Deputies made 127 visits to the various buildings of the Holt Public Schools, which does not include visits of the full time Deputy assigned as the school resource Deputy.

SCHOOL EVENTS:

On March 13th I attended the Sycamore Elementary Kindness Club meeting. The kids had many questions about Fire Fighters and Law Enforcement Officers. The kids were then allowed to see fire trucks and my patrol vehicle up close where more questions were answered.

March 14th was National Walk-out day. I assisted both Holt Junior High School and Holt High School with their events. Both events went on as planned without any major issues.

March 21st was Career Day at Holt Junior High School. I spoke to four (4) different groups about the education and training required to become a Law Enforcement Officer. I also discussed the tools/equipment used by Law Enforcement as well as the various duties of Officers within Law Enforcement.

On March 27th I assisted with mock interviews at Holt High School North Campus. I interviewed four (4) students and critiqued them on things such as: Posture, communication skills, and appearance.

On March 30th a lockdown drill was done at Midway Early Learning Center. Delhi Fire assisted and a safety evaluation was done on the building. The evaluation focused on the safety status of the building as well as what improvements might need to be made to increase safety measures. Emergency Management Director Jim Porcello of Delhi Fire completed an evaluation form that was to be provided to the school at a later time.

COMMUNITY POLICING HIGHLIGHTS:

On March 7th Lt. Jungel and I met with Superintendent Dr. Hornak to discuss the new Safe School Initiative implemented by Sheriff Wriggelsworth. It was a general meeting to discuss the initial implementation of the Safe School Initiative.

On March 12th I met with four (4) elementary and middle school Principals to discuss the Safe School Initiative.

On March 13th I attended Coffee with the Superintendent at Tim Horton's.

On March 19th I attended a School Safety Evaluation meeting with ICSO command, Delhi Fire command, and Dr. Hornak. Discussed was the plan to evaluate each school to check the safety level of each school. A tentative plan was determined.

On March 19th I checked the area of Holt and Cedar. Due to construction, I checked with the crossing guard to determine if the area was safe for students walk after school let out.

On March 20th Channel 6 news interviewed me and followed me around HHS. The interview asked about the Safe School Initiative implanted by Sheriff Wriggelsworth. Furthermore, they wanted to see what my day would be like.

On March 21st I attended the Safe School press conference at Holt High School North Campus. After the conference, I was interviewed by Lansing State Journal regarding the duties of a School Resource Officer.

On March 23rd along with Principal Michael Willard, Counselor John Connor, I met with a student and their parent at HHS Main Campus regarding graffiti found on a desk. The student had drawn swastikas on a desk. The student was determined to be Jewish and stated it was drawn as a bad joke. No threats had been made. The student was disciplined by the school.

On March 28th I attended an Active Violence Incident table top discussion at Delhi Fire. The meeting included Law Enforcement, Delhi Fire, Ingham Central Dispatch, Holt High School administration, and a Delhi Board member. Several scenarios were discussed along with how each group would respond to the situation as well as what was expected of each group.

COMPLAINTS:

During the month of March I responded to a total of 15 calls for service. It should be noted that with the implementation of the Safe Schools Initiative, my role in some of the schools is slightly diminished. Some of the calls responded to are listed below:

On March 1st I assisted Dep. Hughett in Stonegate Trailer Park regarding a threats complaint between a 7 year old and a 9 year old. It was alleged a student brought a knife onto a school bus. A parent became upset that student was allowed on school bus next day. It was later determined that the family was not notified the student was suspended from the bus. I also contacted Dimondale Elementary about the incident to ensure they were informed of situation as there was a possibility of problems between the parents of the children.

On March 2nd I took a possible threats complaint at Holt Junior High School. Investigation determined that a student allegedly stated they wanted to go on a shooting spree. There was dispute in actual statement made. Report to be forwarded to Ingham County Prosecutors Office for review.

On March 5th I participated in mobile field force at MSU in response to a Richard Spencer speaking event and protesters from Antifa. Approximately 26 people were arrested.

On March 6th I apprehended a student at Holt Junior High that was requested by Child Protective Services. The student was transported to Child Protective Services without incident.

On March 8th a bomb threat was found in the women's restroom at Holt High School Main Campus. Suspect was identified and interviewed. A search warrant was done on the residence of the suspect. Incident was forwarded to Ingham County Prosecutors Office for review.

On March 14th a student at Holt High School North Campus was discovered to be in possession of a small amount of marijuana. Incident was handled by the school.

On March 19th I assisted in attempting to locate a possible suicidal female that went into woods near M99/Waverly. I observed the female exit the woods near my location. She was subsequently taken to CMH.

On March 22nd I was Holt High School Main Campus when it was reported 7 students each possibly stole some Gatorade that was sitting on a table in the east commons. All parties admitted to take the Gatorade. A victim could not be located.

On March 22nd I received information that a student on social media had stated that a student had a bomb at the Holt Junior High School on March 21st. It should be noted I was in the building at the time. It was determined that a student showed another student a cylindrical object that sparked when it was poked with a paper clip. The student was removed from class. The kid was discovered to have a AA battery wrapped in paper with a hole in the side. The parents of the student were notified.

On March 27th I responded to Holt Junior High School regarding a student that ran away from his mother. The student's mother had responded to HJHS regarding the student misbehaving in class. The student and mother got into a verbal argument and the student fled from the area. The student was eventually located near the football field and returned to the school. The parent was notified.

On March 28th I was requested at Holt Junior High School due to a student that refused to leave. The student left without incident when I arrived.

On March 28th I was provided information regarding social media postings stating that a student in Holt Junior High School had possibly made threats to shoot at the school. I arrived at HJHS and was informed that no threats were made but that the incident was already handled by HJHS. Parents were notified and the student was sent home.

TRAINING:

On March 5th I attended in-service training at ICSO. The training included legal updates and haz-mat.

March 1st I was dispatched to 3955 Patient Care Dr. to a local physician's office for a potentially suicidal subject to transport. I made contact with the reporting doctor at the doctor's office. Based on statements made from the elderly female, I advised the doctor to have the female transported to an emergency room and not CMH Crisis Services. This determination was due to the female being seen for other medical issues at the doctor's office. The female was transported to Sparrow Hospital Emergency Room by Lansing Fire Department Ambulance. The doctor completed the PRT paperwork and faxed it to Sparrow ER.

I was assigned to assist the Michigan State University Police Department for a civil disturbance on the campus of MSU. This disturbance was located at the MSU

Pavilion and involved a controversial speaker. I was assigned to MSU from noon until 8 pm.

On March 8th I assisted Ingham County Animal Control with a search warrant on Ashbrook Dr. in Holt. The case is still pending with the Ingham County Detective Bureau. Also on March 8th I was dispatched to Kroger for an infant locked inside a vehicle. The child remained asleep and the vehicle was opened by a local tow agency.

March 12th I was dispatched to a local elementary school for the report of found property. I met with the Principal and was given a 9 mm bullet (projectile only). This was only the bullet, no case, powder or primer. The stepfather of the 9 year old boy came to the school and recovered the projectile. The stepfather stated he reloads his own target ammo and this one must have fell on the floor near the door.

On March 14th I was dispatched to a threat complaint at Old Orchard Apartments. I interviewed the reporting party and recorded his statement. I attempted to contact the accused in this complaint but was not able to reach her. I made contact with the guardian service of the accused and spoke to her assigned guardian. I advised the property had placed a trespass notice against her client. I placed a copy of the notice in the records book at the office.

March 15th I received a larceny complaint from Tazmanian Tire. The accused had a new set of tires placed on his vehicle after he traded in his other tires. The accused then left the business without paying for the tires. I left repeated messages for the accused and never received a return call. I forwarded the incident to the Ingham County Prosecuting Attorney for the larceny charge against the accused.

I assisted other Delhi patrol units with a search for a 38 year old suicidal female from Stonegate Trailer Park. On March 19th I was dispatched to Stonegate and checked the surrounding area. I set up a perimeter point after checking a local farm for the subject. The subject was located inside the perimeter and transported to Sparrow Hospital for PRT mental health screening.

On March 20th I was dispatched to Planet Fitness for a threat complaint. I interviewed the reporting party and recorded her statement. I interviewed the accused and recorded her statement. I advised the accused the business has placed a trespass notice against her. I placed a copy of the notice on file at the office.

March 21st I received a telephone call from a business on Pine Tree Rd regarding the theft of a tailgate. The tailgate came off a company truck that was left parked on site. I interviewed employees and neighboring businesses. I was unable to locate any suspect information regarding the theft.

Due to the recent roadside construction near N. Cedar St. and N. Aurelius Rd., I have been focusing on vehicles cutting through parking lots. On March 23rd alone I stopped 5 vehicles for cutting through the Rite Aid parking lot to circumvent the traffic light. This area has remained a focus during the construction. All Delhi units have been attentive to the danger this places on the business customers and crews working at these sites.

Also on March 23rd, I gave a traffic presentation to students at Trinity Church on Dunckel Rd. This presentation was for a group of young people near the age of 14. After the presentation, I fielded questions from the kids and parents.

March 27th I participated in a lockdown drill at the Midway Early Learning Center. I checked the exterior of the building with Jim Porcello from Delhi Fire Department Emergency Management. The drill performance of student and staff exceeded expectations.

March 28th I participated in a lockdown drill at the Lansing Christian School. I checked the room doors, exterior doors and hallways with the staff. The drill was smooth and well conducted by all involved.
