HIGHLIGHTED EVENTS:

Sheriff's Safer Schools Initiative

Delhi Township Deputies continued the Safer Schools Initiative in May conducting 108 random visits to all of the Holt Schools. This does not include the daily presence of Delhi Township's School Resource Deputy.

Realize Cedar Traffic:

I am happy to report to the board that we have not seen any significant increase in traffic related complaints due to the Realize Cedar construction project. The planners did an outstanding job in preparing the alternate routes, deploying adequate signage and publicizing the need to find alternate routes.

Highlighted Calls for Service

Delhi Deputies have continued to respond to opioid overdoses. Fortunately, the month of May did not see any overdose fatalities which can be attributed to the quick and professional responses of Delhi Fire Department medics.

May 3:

Dep. Vanells responded to the 7-11 for a retail fraud complaint. The juvenile suspect was located, the property was returned and the suspect was turned over to parents.

May 12:

Delhi Deputies responded with the Fire Department to a house fire on Camperdown. The fire is currently under investigation.

May 12:

Deputy Khan arrested a 26 year old man for OUID after he crashed into a pole at Bishop and M99. The driver admitted to using heroin prior to driving.

May 17:

Delhi Deputies responded to a report of a suicidal subject at a residence on Aurelius Road. Deputies forced entry after being unable to get a response. The male victim was found lethargic inside and was transported to the ER by Delhi Fire.

May 18:

Delhi Deputies responded to two separate opioid overdoses. Both subjects were treated and released.

Delhi Deputies responded to a report of a home invasion on Holt Road. The suspect had broken a window to gain entry and was found intoxicated and asleep in side. He was arrested for parole violation and lodged at ICJ.

May 19:

Delhi Deputies responded to an overdose on Mccue Road. The suspect was treated and arrested for parole violation.

Delhi Deputies responded to the Windmill trailer park for a disorderly subject. The suspect had several outstanding warrants and resisted arrest. He was subsequently treated at the hospital for minor injuries and lodged at ICJ for the warrants and resisting arrest.

May 20:

Delhi Deputies responded to an alarm at the Midway School and located 3 juveniles inside the building. There was no damage to the building and the suspects were turned over to parents.

Delhi Deputies responded to Mccue Road on a report that the building had been broken into. Two juvenile suspects were located and turned over to parents.

May 21:

Delhi Deputies responded to a reported armed robbery at the Prestwick Village complex. This case is still under investigation but is believed to be drug related.

May 24:

Delhi Business Deputy Rowley obtained a confession to a \$6,000 embezzlement from a Delhi business. The case has been referred for prosecution.

May 25:

Delhi Deputies found a woman huffing a chemical in Jaycee park. She was transported for medical treatment by Delhi Fire.

May 27:

Delhi Deputies took several complaints on Coolridge Rd reference prior parties and damage caused by party attendees. CPO Deputy Hollern is working with the homeowners on a solution to the problem renters.

May 28:

Delhi Deputies responded to two domestics and made arrests.

Delhi Deputies responded to a suicidal subject on Dell Road and subsequently took a male into protective custody and transported him to Sparrow Hospital for treatment.

May 29:

Deputies responded to the Midway School on an alarm at 3am. Multiple teen were located in the parking lot. One window in the school was found to be broken, but no other damage was found. Parents were contacted. One female suspect had a seizure on scene and was turned over to Delhi medics for treatment.

STATISTICS:

During the month of May, Deputies responded to 265 calls for service, made 263 traffic stops and wrote 80 citations. They investigated 24 traffic crashes. They also made 74 arrests, 43 of which were self-initiated, proactive arrests. Deputies dedicated 281 hours to community policing and participated in 104 hours of training.

May the second I responded to Kroger for a shoplifting theft that had just occurred. I heard the description of the female suspect and her vehicle. I recognized both and went to her residence in Windmill Trailer Park. I made contact with the female at the residence. The female told me she did take food items and showed me the items she took. The female stated she had Child Protective Services conducting an inspection of her home today. I detained the female and returned her to Kroger.

Once at Kroger the female apologized to the management for stealing the items. The female returned the items to Kroger and was given a trespass notice for all Kroger stores. Kroger choose not to prosecute. I arrested the female on a shoplifting warrant from the Lansing Police Department and turned her over to LPD.

On May sixth I participated in the Epifany Now local charity event. This event is a, pass it forward, event. I worked from the Martin Luther King Blvd. Kroger store. At this store I worked with MSUFCU staff and passed out \$5 gift cards to shoppers throughout the store. Afterward, there was an event meeting at the MSUFCU headquarters building where all event participants returned to share ideas and experiences.

May eighth I was dispatched to a prescription fraud incident at the Mid-West Center for Sleep Disorder. The office manager reviewed the quarterly prescription report and noticed discrepancies. The office manager found there were bogus prescriptions written in the practicing doctor's name that were not legitimate and for narcotic medications. This incident is still under investigation.

Also on May eighth I was dispatched to Shroyer Auto Parts for the report of check fraud. The company reported fraudulent checks were written and attempted to be cashed in Arkansas. The checks were forged former checks of the business. The banking establishments intercepted the attempted fraud and security precautions were put into place by Shroyer.

May ninth I was dispatched to the Burger King restaurant on E. Jolly Rd. for the report of a Larceny in a Building. The store manager told me she had a twenty dollar bill in her purse that was stolen. The manager told me one of her employees had gone into the manager's office, took her money from her wallet that was in her backpack. The manager provided video of the theft. I attempted to make contact with the employee but he never returned any calls. I forwarded the case to the Ingham County Prosecuting Attorney's Office for a felony warrant request of LFB.

May 15th I participated in the Safety Day Picnic at Hawk Island Park. This event is held to recognize students who participate in their schools safety programs. The event provides students to meet professionals from various backgrounds of community service. There were representatives from the Capital Area Dive Team, FBI Crime Scene Technicians, Ingham County 911 Dispatch, Ingham County Sheriff's Office Deputies, Fire Department, EMT staff, START Team and many more organizations.

On May 18th I was dispatched to the CVS Pharmacy regarding counterfeit notes being passed. The suspect passed five counterfeit \$100 notes and purchased a gift card totaling \$450. I forwarded the report and notes to the U.S. Secret Service. I circulated an I-bulletin to local law enforcement. I received responses from Meridian Township Police Department and Lansing Township Police Department that the same suspect committed the identical crimes at their pharmacies.

Also on May 18th I received an embezzlement complaint from the Burger King restaurant on Cedar St. The Director of Operations and Regional Manager stated the store's general manager stole nearly \$6000. I interviewed the suspect for a total of four hours on two separate occasions.

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The suspect confessed to stealing the money. This report will be forwarded to the Ingham County Prosecuting Attorney for the charge of embezzlement against the general manager.

On May 21st I received a larceny from automobile complaint at the Delhi office. The victim advised she left her vehicle unlocked behind her employer. The victim reported she later went out to her car and her purse was missing. The suspect(s) attempted to use the credit card at various different places. The victim was made whole by her credit union and needed the report for her file. A Good Samaritan located the victim's wallet and other cards, which she returned to the victim.

May 23rd I received a shoplifting complaint from Rite Aid Pharmacy. The manager reported a male and female came into the store. The male attempted to distract the cashier while the female went to the liquor aisle and stuck five bottles of vodka into her sweatshirt. The female then walked out the door with the male following her. I created an I-bulletin and circulated it to local law enforcement agencies. I was returned with a possible suspect to interview. The investigation is ongoing.

On May 29th I was dispatched to an embezzlement at the Speedway Gas Station on Jolly Rd. at Dunckel Rd. I interviewed the store manager who told me an employee had taken a full book of lottery tickets from the store. The manager stated he had video of the employee taking the tickets. The manager also advised the employee had attempted to cash in one of the \$50 winning tickets.

I made contact with the suspect at her residence. The suspect confessed to taking the tickets and gave me all 80 of the tickets back. The tickets were not activated, and there was no monetary loss to the store or State of Michigan. The value of the tickets is \$400.00. The suspect has a prior larceny conviction on her records. I submitted the incident to the Ingham County Prosecuting Attorney's Office for the charge of embezzlement against the former employee.

On May 31st I received a complaint of counterfeit note being passed at Derosa's Party Store. I interviewed the store owner and recovered the fake \$100.00 bill. I made contact with the suspect

via telephone who denied knowing the note was counterfeit. I forwarded the note and report to the U.S. Secret Service Office in Grand Rapids.

SCHOOL EVENTS:

On May 3rd a safety assessment was done on Elliott Elementary. Possible problem areas were discussed with Principal North.

On May 7th a safety assessment was done on Horizon Elementary. Possible problem areas were discussed with Principal Huard.

On May 9th I participated in the annual Ride a Bike to School Day at Horizon Elementary.

On May 21st I participated in Portfolio Days at Holt High School Main Campus.

COMMUNITY POLICING HIGHLIGHTS:

On May 8th I participated in a memorial ceremony at Ingham County Sheriff's Office as a member of the Honor Guard.

On May 9th I participated in the Coffee with the Superintendent at Tim Horton's.

On May 15th I participated in the Safety Patrol Picnic at Hawk Island.

On May 16th I met with a student at Holt High School Main Campus who had questions regarding

the laws of stalking and Personal Protection Orders.

On May 28th I assisted in policing the Memorial Day Parade.

On May 31st I participated in School Bus traffic enforcement. One traffic stop was made. Driver was advised of the violation.

COMPLAINTS:

During the month of May I responded to 19 total calls for service. Nine (9) calls resulted in written complaints and ten (8) calls resulted in blotters. It should be noted I was gone several days due to illness and several calls were handled by CPO DEP. HOLLERN. Some of the calls I responded to are as follows:

On May 2nd I responded to Windmill Trailer park regarding a breaking and entering at a residence. Investigation determined a 12 year old broke into her former residence to retrieve some of her personal items. The family had been evicted some weeks prior. No charges were to be sought by Windmill. Windmill advised arrangements would be made to give the family some time to retrieve personal items.

On May 3rd I assisted DEP. VANELLS with a retail fraud at 7 Eleven at Aurelius and Holt. The suspect was a student from Holt Junior High School. The parents were notified who responded to the scene. I notified Holt Junior High School that the student would not be attending school that day.

On May 3rd I assisted in breaking up a fight at Holt High School Main Campus between three (3) males. I stopped the verbal altercation before it became physical with the assistance of HHS Security.

On May 3rd I responded to a possible suicidal subject at Holt High School North Campus. Investigation determined the student was at home with family. I made contact with the parents and provided them information for Community Mental Health.

On May 4th while I was in Holt High School Main Campus six (6) males believed to be from Everett High School entered the building during lunch hour. I escorted the subjects out of the building. Photos were taken of the subject to be forwarded to Everett High School for identification and possible no-trespass letters.

On May 4th I assisted with a 2 car Personal Injury Accident that occurred at Holt and Kahres. Investigation determined that an elderly driver was eastbound on Holt Road and ran the red light at the intersection striking a Holt High student driving from the main campus to the north campus. Both drivers suffered minor injuries and were transported to the hospital.

On May 9th I assisted Eaton County in obtaining information regarding a Holt High School student whom had sent images of an extended handgun magazine to a student of Charlotte High School. The two students had been participating in a threatening social media exchange. I informed Holt High School of the exchange. The student was interviewed about the incident. Determined that the student did not have any weapons at home and the image sent was pulled off the internet.

On May 10th I responded to Holt Junior High School regarding a student who had attempted to obtain nude photos from another student via social media. The student admitted to the exchange.

The parents of the other student did not want to seek charges.

On May 11th I was approached by a parent at Holt High School Main Campus regarding her student posting inappropriate things to an unknown subject via social media. The parent was concerned as several individuals had threatened her student. The student was talked to about the incident and advised the other parties were not known. Family of the unknown individual came to Holt High School. I talked to them and advised them the matter was being handled. All parties were advised to get off social media and retract all statements.

On May 11th It was discovered that there was a possible bomb threat written in a Holt High School Main Campus restroom. Investigation determined it was unknown when the statement was written and there was no exact date and time as to when it was to occur. Furthermore, it was believed to have been a previous written statement that another subject had altered to look like the word "bomb." No suspects were developed.

On May 17th at Holt High School Main Campus an unknown student reported to a teacher that another student had alcohol hidden in a water bottle. Investigation determined that a student had stolen some vodka from home and had it in school in a clear water bottle. Video/Interview determined that a total of nine (9) students had taken a drink from the bottle. None of the students appeared intoxicated. All of the students admitted to drinking from the bottle. Parents were notified for all students.

On May 18th I assisted Holt High School Main Campus staff in dealing with two (2) separate verbal altercations, a student attempting to hit another student with sporting equipment, and met with a parent of a student who was involved in a physical altercation.

On May 21st I met with Principal Willard and a student at Holt High School Main Campus regarding a student making inappropriate jokes regarding the Parkland High School shooter. The student admitted to the jokes and advised it would not happen again. No threats were made.

On May 25th I responded to Washington Woods Middle School regarding a student missing from school property. As we began to get a perimeter set up the student was found hiding on school grounds. I talked to the student and parents were notified.

On May 25th I responded to Holt Junior High School regarding a late assault. Investigation determined after being slapped on the back of the neck a student threw a pen at another student striking that student in the eye. Incident was handled internally. While I was there I was informed of another assault. It was determined that a student stole a pop of another student. The second student became upset and attacked the first student. The students were talked to. The pop was returned and the matter was handled internally.

On May 31st I responded to Washington Woods Middle School regarding three (3) students disclosing being inappropriately touched by a staff member. The matter was immediately turned over to the Ingham County Sheriff's Office Detective Bureau.

TRAINING:

On May 8th I participated in on-line departmental policy training: Ride-Alongs, Special Ops trailer, Body Armor, Incident Reports, Alarm Response, Interim Bonds, Dept. Equipment and Property, and Key Control.

On May 29th I participated in on-line departmental policy training: Deadly force, inmate

I responded to 8 Dispatch complaints and 1 Accident complaint for the month of May, the complaints ranged from Trouble with Subject to CSC.

I had 23 School visits for a total of 16 hours and 46 minutes to Holt schools for the month of May

I had 28 Business contacts for the month.

I was able to participate with MSU credit union and ePIFanyNow.org. Myself and Deputy Rowley were able to pass out Kroger gift cards to individuals in the store. ePIFanyNow.org is a non-profit, grassroots organization committed to creating positive change. Each individual in our group purchased \$20.00 dollars' worth of Kroger gift cards and passed them out to random people in the store.

I assisted the Training section with a complete download of the Delhi Tasers.

I was able to attend 'Community Policing Training' in Grand Rapids, The course was presented by the Dolan Consulting group. I learned several key factors regarding Community Policing. I have started to implement some of those strategies in the community. The Main strategy being an "Out of Car" Experience, my goal is to walk around the community and try to interact with the citizens. The course was a total of 16 hours.

I had the privilege of working at the Safety Patrol Picnic at Hawk Hollow. Myself and Deputies Rowley and Hutting operated the Seatbelt convincer. Showing the kids how important it is to wear a seatbelt.

I was able to have Intern John Stevens with ICSO work with me.

Myself and Det. Teresa Lewis participated in a County wide Sex offender address verification. Det. Lewis and I were able to knock on 44 doors in an 8 hours shift.

The speed signs are up and running, they are stationed at Dean Ave., just north of Holt rd and Caleta drive at Hydra.

I was able to take a Drug complaint at Holt Jr High, and will be sending the complaint to the prosecutor for a warrant.
