RE: Delhi Division Monthly Report for the month of November, 2018

Noteworthy Events:

We are very grateful to the residents of Delhi Township who renewed the Law Enforcement Millage on November 6. The community support is humbling to every Deputy with the honor to serve in Delhi.

Highlighted November Calls for Service:

November 3:

Deputies responded to a heroin overdose at an address on Aurelius Road. The 55 year old male was pronounced dead at McLaren Hospital.

Deputies responded to a residence at Huntley Villa apartments on a report of a domestic assault in progress. A male suspect was arrested and lodged at ICJ.

November 4:

Deputies investigated a drunk and disorderly complaint at Rocky's Roadhouse Bar and arrested the male suspect.

Deputies investigated a home invasion on Ring Neck. Unknown suspects entered the garage and removed property.

Deputies responded to a drug overdose in the Windmill Trailer Park. The 46 year old female was pronounced dead at the Emergency Room.

November 6:

Delhi Deputies responded to a domestic assault at the Stonegate Trailer park and subsequently arrested a male suspect for assault by strangulation.

Deputies investigated a complaint of criminal sexual conduct between two 16 year old juveniles.

November 7:

Delhi Deputies responded to the Holt High School on a report of 5 unknown juveniles who entered the building and ran from security. The juveniles were captured nearby. They were served with no trespass letters and issued citations for disorderly conduct.

November 11:

Delhi Deputies responded to a domestic on Halifax and subsequently arrested the female resident on outstanding warrants and domestic assault.

Deputies investigated an auto theft on Wildflower. The keys were left in the unlocked vehicle overnight and it was taken by unknown suspects.

November 13:

Deputies investigated a handwritten bomb threat at the high school. A confession was obtained from two female suspects and charges are being sought.

November 19:

Delhi units responded to a domestic involving a gun on Anchor Court. After a stand-off, a male suspect was peacefully taken into custody and subsequently lodged at the jail.

Deputies arrested a man for OWI on Aurelius Road who had a BAC of .33. Following medical clearance, he was lodged at the jail.

November 21:

Deputies responded to a domestic at the Village Inn Motel and subsequently arrested a male suspect for assault.

November 22:

Deputies responded to a natural death on Beechnut Trail.

Deputies responded to a fight involving a knife at the Windmill Trailer park. The involved parties were not cooperative.

November 24:

Deputy Torok initiated a traffic stop on Aurelius Road and subsequently arrested the male and female occupants for outstanding warrants and possession of meth and cocaine.

November 25:

Deputies responded to a domestic in which the male was reported being high on meth and breaking things in his residence. He was cooperative and was provided transportation out of the area. He returned to the residence and began kicking the front door. He was arrested for disorderly conduct and lodged at the jail.

Deputies responded to a domestic on Willesdon Avenue and subsequently arrested a female resident for domestic assault.

November 28:

Deputies investigated a child abuse complaint at Willoughby Estates.

Deputies investigated a B&E at the Jersey Giant Restaurant on Jolly Road. Unknown suspects broke through a front window with a rock and entered the business. The owner responded and reported that the office had not been entered and nothing appeared missing.

November 29:

Deputies responded to a mentally incapacitated female on Renfrew Way. The resident had obtained a court order to have her adult daughter evaluated for addiction to meth and erratic behavior. The daughter fled the scene, but was apprehended a short distance away and was safely transported for mental health treatment by Delhi Fire Ambulance.

Delhi Deputies investigated a traffic crash on M-99 at Bishop Road involving a Lansing Police Car.

Delhi SRO Belanger arrested a male student at the high school after he assaulted another student, HS security staff and Dep. Belanger. The juvenile was

transported for mental health evaluation and charges were requested for assault and attempting to disarm a police officer.

STATISTICS:

During the month of November, Delhi Deputies responded to 255 calls for service, made 217 traffic stops and wrote 88 citations. They investigated 57 traffic crashes. They also made 60 arrests, of which 30 were self-initiated, proactive arrests. Deputies dedicated 219 hours to community policing and participated in 202 hours of annual training.

During the month of November, Delhi Deputies also made 63 random visits to Holt Schools in support of the Sheriff's Safer Schools Initiative.

I was also able to the assist Dep. Belanger with a Narcotics complaint at the Jr. High. 2 subjects will be charged with Possession with Intent to Deliver.

I was able to participate with our training unit and assist with Active Violence Training for our Department

I was able to participate with the Lighting of the Delhi Christmas Tree at Veterans Memorial Park.

On November 1st Elliot Elementary had a lockdown Drill

November 6th was Election Day in which we saw several schools hosting voter precincts I worked with school staff to ensure safety for students while we had guests in the buildings.

On November 13th I attended the Monthly bus garage staff meeting

On November 28th I attended to District Safety Committee Meeting

COMMUNITY POLICING HIGHLIGHTS:

During the month on November I continued to make contact with students involved in the BAU program. I also provided a student a ride to school who had missed the bus and

mentored several students on various topics including their relationships with parents and social media use.

November 5th I attended Community Coffee with Dr. Hornak at Tim Hortons

On November 28th I attended the Delhi Township Christmas Tree Lighting

COMPLAINTS:

During the month of November I responded to a total of 23 calls for service. These calls included requests for back-up by other deputies as well as complaints that did not require a written report. The calls for service included: Suspicious situations, a bomb threat, child custody disputes, child abuse, Assault and possession of narcotics.

On November 1st I responded to Washington Woods Middle School for a child custody dispute. The issue was resolved without incident. I also responded to Holt High School for a possible child abuse report.

On November 6th I met with a student at Wilcox elementary who was hitting their teachers. The student was mentored about proper classroom behavior and no charges were sought.

On November 13th A bomb threat was found written on a bathroom wall in the Holt High School. The School was placed on a perimeter lockdown as the threat was investigated. The threat was found to not be credible. The two students who wrote the threat were quickly identified and charges are being sought.

On November 15th I responded to Dimondale Elementary reference a teacher who was receiving harassing phone calls from an unknown person. The teacher will be following up with IT to have their extension changed.

On November 16th I responded to Horizon Elementary for a Private Property accident involving a school bus. There were no students on the bus at the time of the crash and there were no reported injuries.

On November 19th I followed up with Dimondale Elementary as well as the bus garage in reference to a report Night Shift Deputies took regarding a student being left at the bus stop.

On November 20th I investigated a report of possible sexting at the Holt High School the incident was unfounded.

On November 20th I also responded to the Holt High School after a student reported what they thought was a gun being loaded in the bathroom. Deputies made contact with a student who had locked themselves in the bathroom stall. After approximately 20 minutes talking with the student they exited the bathroom without incident. The sound that the student had heard was discovered to be a belt buckle.

On November 26th I responded to a possible home invasion. The house was found to have been gone through but no one was located inside.

On November 27th I responded to the North Campus for a threats complaint.

On November 28th I responded to Holt High School for a private property hit and run. There were no injuries and a suspect has been identified.

On November 28th I also responded to the Holt Jr High School reference a student in possession of an unknown white powder. The powder was tested using the Tru Narc device and identified as Confectioners' Sugar.

On November 29th while on patrol at the Holt High School a fight between students occurred. After the fight was broken up by school staff one of the students tried to run back into the building to continue assaulting the student they had fought with. I stopped the student and a struggle ensued. The student was eventually controlled and transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation. Charges are being sought on the student for simple assault, resisting and obstructing and attempted disarming of a police officer.

On November 30th I responded to the Holt Jr High reference students selling pills. Two students were identified after they had sold several pills in the building as being Xanax and Percocet. The pills were found to no be controlled substances. The students who were selling the pills will be charged Delivery of an imitation controlled substance.

TRAINING:

From 11-07-18 until 11-09-2018 I attended Community Policing: Winning back your community training. This training was focused on community policing efforts and how they can lead to positive relationships with the community.

November 2nd

Deputy Jason Kuch and I responded to Kroger for a retail fraud complaint. Kroger management had a subject in custody who had attempted to steal a large amount of merchandise from the store. The subject was found to have multiple outstanding warrants. The subject was also in possession of other stolen property, marijuana, and meth. The Subject complained of injury and

was transported to McLaren Hospital for evaluation. The subject was quickly cleared by McLaren staff and lodged at the Ingham County jail on multiple felony charges.

November 5th

I responded to Domino's to follow up on a Robbery of one of their delivery drivers that previously occurred. The delivery driver was uncooperative with our investigation and advised that he would not participate in attempting to identify the suspect. The case was subsequently closed due to no further investigative leads.

I responded to Kroger for a late report of an attempted retail fraud. A subject had pushed an entire cart full of groceries out of the store but fled the scene when confronted by staff. The property was recovered and the investigation is ongoing.

November 6th

I responded to 2700 Eaton Rapids Rd to assist Delhi Deputies with a domestic assault. The suspect was arrested for domestic assault and lodged at the Ingham County Jail.

November 7th

I responded to the Holt High School to assist Delhi Deputies with 5 subjects who entered the school without permission. The intention of the subjects was not known. 3 of the subjects fled into the woods South of the School when approached by Police. All 3 subjects were located and issued citations for disorderly conduct for failure to comply with police orders. All 5 Subjects were issued no trespass orders by the school.

November 9th

I attended a meeting at the Holt High School regarding a student who had threatened a teacher the previous day. School resource Officer Belanger was not available due to a training commitment. The school was able to resolve the issue internally without police action.

November 13th

I assisted with a bomb threat at the Holt High School. The subjects responsible were identified and there was no actual danger to the school or students.

November 20th

I responded to the construction site at 2325 Jarco Dr. for a report of a larceny of tools. I made contact with the company owner who advised that someone had broken into a trailer containing tools at the construction site. Over \$4000.00 worth of tools were taken. The investigation is ongoing.

November 23rd Through December 3rd I was on vacation.
